Books and journals

Books and current journals on the theory and practice of education can be found on floor 1A.

Many of the journal titles are available online and off campus. Search the library catalogue to see titles available to you, e.g. *Studies in Higher Education* and *Research into Higher Education Abstracts*.

We also have growing collections of ebooks and digital videos which you can access via links in the catalogue.

Online

ERIC - Educational Resources Information Center

A primary source for education literature, ERIC is US based but international in coverage. There are 2 ways to access ERIC:

1. **The ERIC website** - freely available to all with no login required. You are able to create an account for access to the My ERIC community.
2. **ERIC via EBSCO** - login required off-campus. This route makes ERIC cross-searchable with another substantial education database: British Education Index. It also provides links to full-text articles wherever these are available, plus the ability to export to RefWorks.

Higher Education Empirical Research Database (HEERD)

Summaries of evidence-based published research on a range of topics related to higher education. Free to register.

British Universities Film & Video Council (BUFVC): Databases

Details of around 30,000 currently available audio-visual materials selected for their usefulness in higher education, further education and research.

BoB National: Database

A radio and TV programme recording system operated by the BUFVC. The service gives access to all the major channels with a searchable archive of over 800,000 programmes, some back to 2008.
